DANIEL YERGIN

IHS Vice Chairman

Daniel Yergin is Vice Chairman at the Information Handling Services (IHS) and is a Pulitzer-Prize winning author and leading authority on energy, international politics and economics.

Yergin is a highly respected authority on energy, international politics and economics. He is the Founder of IHS Cambridge Energy Research Associates and Vice Chairman of IHS. The International Association for Energy Economics gave Dr Yergin its 2012 award for "*outstanding contributions to the profession of energy economics and to its literature.*" In 2014, India's Prime Minister Manmohan Singh presented him a Lifetime Achievement Award, and he was awarded James Schlesinger Medal for Energy Security by U.S. Secretary of Energy Ernie Moniz. Dr Yergin serves on the U.S. Secretary of Energy Advisory Board and chaired the US Department of Energy's Task Force on Strategic Energy Research and Development. He is a member of the advisory board's subcommittee that issued its report on shale gas at the request of President Obama. Dr Yergin is a member of the National Petroleum Council, a trustee of the Brookings Institution and a director of the United States Energy Association and of the US-Russia Business Council. He is a member of the Advisory Board of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) Energy Initiative, and Singapore's International Energy Advisory Board. He received his BA from Yale University in 1968 and earned his PhD in International Relations (1974) from Cambridge University where he was a Marshall Scholar. He also holds honorary doctoral degrees from Colorado School of Mines, University of Houston, and the University of Missouri.
